Bullets:

Why does the Torah elaborate here on the Shemita and the people's concern?
 Why isn't the beracha just presented. Is Hashem only presenting the beracha as a result of the people's complaints? R. Zusha said, in the name of the Noam
 Elimelech, that Hashem creates spiritual pipelines to connect to Him. When we challenge Him, we need a repairman to repair the pipe (the *beracha*).

Bullets:

- The **Otzar Peleos HaTorah** quotes a source that one cannot gain more than Hashem wants you to get. If you cheat the system, you will be punished and your ill gotten gains will be taken away ('for I Hashem am your God').

Bullets:

- **Rashi** says that because man's thoughts are greatly attracted by the idea of taking interest and it comes difficult to him to keep aloof from it, so that he tries to persuade himself that it is a legitimate act. Scripture was compelled to state: "But be afraid of thy God!"
- **R. Yerucham Levovitz**, based on this Rashi, says that trying to find the easiest way out comes from a lack of fear of Hashem.
- The **Otzar Peleos HaTorah** discusses the concept of interest with words. For example, can you say 'thank you' for a loan.
- What is the connection between a snake and lending with interest? R. Yosef
 Sorotzkin says it is connected to the Primordial snake: in both cases we are led away from Hashem.

Bullets:

- The **Rachmastrivka Rebbe** understands וְנָתַתִּי גִשְׁמֵיֶכָם בְּעָתֵּם as saying that Hashem will give us our גשמיות thoughts in the right time, not during davening, for example.
- The **Degel Machane Ephraim** says that אָהָשָּׁיג לָכֶם דַּיִשׁ means that Hashem will give us time for ourselves.
- The **Chasam Sofer** says we need to not only learn, but we also need to teach and to toil.
